What are the documents required to file a provisional patent specification?

The Patents Act 1970(39 of 1970) & The Patents Rules, 2003:

- ~• Form 1 (Application for grant of patent)
- ~• Form 2 (Provisional Specifications)
- ~• Form 5 (Declaration of Inventorship)
- ~• Form 26 (Power of Attorney)
- ~ · E-filing fees (Patent statutory fees) : Rs. 1600/-
- ~ · Form 3 (Corresponding foreign patent application statement and undertaking)
- ~• Illustration/Drawing of the invention.
- It has to be kept in mind that If the time period of 12 months within which the applicant has to file complete patent specification, otherwise it will be deemed to be 'ABANDONED'.

□ Steps:

- Step 1: Idea Incubation Phase
- Step 2: Patentability Search
- Step 3: Patent Drafting
- Step 4: Filing Patent Application
- Step 5: Publication of Application
- Step 6: Request for Examination (RFE)
- Step 7: Response to Objections
- Step 8: Grant of Patent: If the controller satisfied with the response to the objections amended patent application, the patent application is put in order of grant.



Content of Patent Application Includes:

- ~• Title of Invention: It should reflect the main art of the invention, should be precise, meaningful And should be normally within 15 words.
- ~• Background of invention: Should describe what others have done in the field and what problems have not been solved by this prior work.
- ~ Summary of Invention
- ~ Brief Description of Drawings
- ~ Object of Invention
- ~ Statement of Invention
- ~ Detailed description of the invention
- · a · Claims
- -- Claims are the essence of a patent.
- -- The first claim would be the Independent claim and Subsequent claim would be dependent claims.
- -- Parts of a Claim:
- (A) The Preamble (B) Transitional Phrase (C) The Body
